



PARKS AND POOLS IN LAKE COUNTY

WEST SIDE COMMUNITY PARK

Parallel Dr. in Lakeport



This park has plenty of open space for children to run. There are soccer and baseball fields, but when there are no games going on it is highly likely that you'll have the place to yourselves. There are paved paths to ride trikes/bikes or push strollers and you'll find benches, water fountains and porta-potties.

LIBRARY PARK

222 Park Street, in Lakeport



The Library Park play structures are brand new and were installed in 2018! This park has mature trees that provide wonderful shade on hot days. The young children's play area is fenced and gated providing peace of mind to parents. This park is right on the water and ducks are frequent visitors. You'll find plenty of tables or grass space for a picnic and a promenade for strolling.

LAKESIDE COUNTY PARK

1985 Park Drive, Lakeport



Lakeside County Park is located on the water midway between the business districts of Lakeport and Kelseyville. There are several softball fields and a boat launch ramp as well as this very shady playground with picnic tables and grills. The shade is the biggest draw to this park on those hot summer days.

NYLANDER COUNTY PARK

12586 Acorn Sreet, Clearlake Oaks



One word: Gorgeous! The play structure is friendly for the younger children, there is a winding path that is perfect for tricycle or strider bikes, the manicured lawn begs to be played on and the picnic spots are shaded and so inviting.

RUSSELL RUSTICI COUNTY PARK

16375 Second Street, Lower Lake



This park is a true community gathering place with plenty of room for large groups and play dates. The entire park is fenced in and it has all of the amenities for a great party spot with covered pavilions and lot so picnic tables.

MIDDLETOWN COUNTY PARK AND POOL

20962 Big Canyon Rd, Middletown



The park has a standard, unshaded play structure (ages 5-12), but the real draw here in the summer is THE POOL! There is a diving board in the larger pool which is a hit with the older kids. The littlest children (and their parents) will appreciate the large kiddie pool where a toddler can play and splash freely in water that comes up to her shins. Daily gate fee rates for children 12 years and under are \$1.25, adult fees (13 years and older) are \$2.00. Children 12 years and under must be accompanied by someone 13 years old or older. Season gate passes are available at the Middletown Pool during its business hours. Family passes are \$80.00 and Individual passes are \$40.00 per season. *(Rates may year to year.)*

UPPER LAKE COUNTY PARK

575 East Hwy 20, Upper Lake



This park, right on Hwy 20, has restrooms, playground equipment, picnic tables, grills, and a baseball field. The play structure is intended for children 5 and up, but there are baby swings. Be careful! The grassy field is sometimes bumpy and uneven due to local wildlife who enjoy the park, so take caution when walking and running.

KEELING COUNTY PARK

3000 Lakeshore Blvd, Nice



This hidden gem really showcases the beauty of Lake County. The play structure is for ages 5-12, but there are baby swings, a gorgeous manicured grassy area perfect for a blanket and a pile of good books. There are also bathrooms, shaded picnic tables, a public pier, grills, and benches. You'll love this park!

HINMAN COUNTY PARK

3494 East Hwy 20, Nice



There is no play structure at this park, but the huge gazebo is a great shady place for little ones to dance, sing, read, or pretend. The lawn is in great shape and perfect for playing with balls or water balloons and there are picnic tables and benches.

LUCERNE HARBOR PARK

6225 East Hwy 20



This park is focused on a children's play structure. Come prepared with umbrellas and sunscreen as shade is hard to come by. Foster's Freeze is right across the street.

ALPINE PARK

5985 East Hwy 20, Lucerne



A truly lovely park right on the water with easy access if you want to help your little one explore and splash. Bathrooms, water fountains, lots of shady picnic tables and the standard age 5-12 play structure with baby swings. The grass is in great shape, but can be a little "squishy" because of its proximity to the lake. The gazebo at the end of the pier has several very large picnic tables, perfect for big group play date and picnic.

AUSTIN PARK

14077 Lakeshore Drive, Clearlake



The view cannot be beat! This park has many amenities: bathrooms, picnic tables play structures for all ages, grills and beach access. This park is situated between a busy street and the lake, so constant adult supervision is a must. The City of Clearlake received funding to upgrade the portion of the park on the opposite side of the street as well, to include an amphitheater, skate park, play structure, walking paths and more.

REDBUD PARK

14655 Lakeshore Dr, Clearlake



There is no play structure here, but there are picnic tables and a big grassy area. The real draw here is the boat ramp. If your little one loves boats, this is a great place to come and enjoy watching all sorts of watercraft come and go while you talk about things that float and sink.

PINE GROVE POOLS

15960 Bottle Rock Rd., Cobb



Pine Grove is a privately owned venue with two swimming pools that are open to the public for a fee. One pool is filled with natural spring water and the other is a traditional chlorinated spring-fed pool with a slide, diving board and two connected kiddie pools. Children age 3 and under swim for free! The entry fee for children over age 3 is \$6 and adults pay \$9 for day use. Pine Grove is surrounded by evergreens and it is typically 10 degrees cooler up on Cobb. *(Prices may change year by year.)*

KELSEYVILLE COUNTY PARK

5270 State Street, Kelseyville



This park is right in the heart of the small town of Kelseyville, in walking distance to pizza parlors, a coffee shop and a general store. It has a semi-shaded play structure and swings and adjoins the basketball court and new skatepark. There are covered picnic tables to enjoy as well.



LAKE COUNTY LIBRARIES

Lake County Libraries are great places to help develop your child's love of books and reading, to meet other parents and grandparents, to enjoy a quiet break in the day, to research topics of interest, and to find out what is going on in the community. MIDDLETOWN LIBRARY

21256 Washington St, Middletown



The Middletown Library thoughtfully adjoins the Senior Center and is adjacent to a beautiful grassy park where community gatherings are frequently held. The big windows and colorful murals make this library bright and beautiful; a delightful place to spend a few minutes or a few hours. The collection of children's books is extensive and there are oodles of other things to capture the attention of the littlest visitors (puzzles, stuffed animals, activity cubes, etc.). UPPER LAKE LIBRARY

310 Second St., Upper Lake



The Upper Lake Library is the smallest of the Lake County Libraries, but it may very well have the most charm. The building has a historic, homey feel and the close quarters, stacks of well-loved books and themed rooms make it feel cozy and inviting. Story Times at Upper Lake Library are typically held every Thursday at 2:00pm, but check the Lake County Libraries website first to make sure.

REDBUD LIBRARY

14785 Burns Valley Rd, Clearlake



The Redbud Library is located at 14785 Burns Valley Rd in Clearlake. Colorful banners, an origami mobile, and the latest creations from the Lego Club will greet you as you walk into this cheerful oasis. Story times here often include songs and crafts. The children who attend love to choose which books are read each week from the selection provided by the story time volunteer who quickly knows each child by name. This is a special place to be sure. LAKEPORT LIBRARY

The Lakeport Library is the main branch in the Lake County Library system. Story time at the Lakeport Library is a real treat and can be crowded at times so arriving early is a good idea. Frequent visitors to Lakeport story times are two of the most gentle and lovable dogs your kids will ever meet! **Lakeport story times during the summer are typically held outdoors on Fridays in Library Park at 10:15am**, with games and crafts and books galore. The story times return indoors to the Lakeport Library branch beginning in August and are held every Friday at 10:15am and 2:30pm.
