- 1. At least annually, review the strategic plan and revise the plan as may be necessary or appropriate. The Commission shall hold at least one public hearing on its periodic review of the plan, and the Board of Supervisors shall find that the plan is consistent with and in furtherance of the purposes of the Act and any guidelines adopted by the state commission before any revisions to the plan are adopted.
- 2. Submit its adopted County strategic plan and any subsequent revision thereto, to the state commission.
- 3. Annually, prepare and adopt an annual audit and report pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 130150. The Commission shall hold at least one public hearing prior to adopting any annual audit and report.
- 4. Conduct at least one public hearing on the annual report of the state commission pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 130150(b).

 be deposited in the Trust Fund, and shall be expended only for the purposes authorized by the Act and in accordance with the County's strategic plan. All grants, gifts and bequests of money made to or for the benefit of the Commission from public or private sources to be used for early childhood development programs shall be deposited in the Trust Fund and expended for the specific purpose for which the grant, gift or bequest was made.

SECTION V. Fiscal and Administrative: In furtherance of one of the purposes of the Act, elimination of duplicate administrative systems, the Department of Health Services is designated as the administrative agent of the County Children and Families First Commission. The Director of the Department of Health Services shall use established County administrative systems, including but not limited to: budgeting, fiscal, purchasing, contracting, renting real or personal property, personnel management, legal services, and automated information systems, all in accordance with County ordinances, policies and procedures, to carry out the purposes of the Act.

Prior to expenditure and in accordance with the adopted strategic plan, all moneys deposited in the County Children and Families First Trust Fund shall be subsequently transferred to a special revenue fund established within the budgetary and accounting systems of the County for appropriation and administration in accordance with established County budgeting, accounting and reporting policies and systems.

SECTION VI. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional and invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares

that it would have passed this ordinance and every section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one of more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, or phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION VII. This ordinance shall be and the same is hereby declared to be in full force and effect from and after thirty (30) days after the date of its passage, and at that time shall be deemed to be operative as of January 1, 1999. This ordinance shall be published once before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after said passage, with the names of the Supervisors voting for or against the same, in a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in the County of Lake, State of California.

AN ORDINANCE REVISING ORDINANCE NO. 2540 ESTABLISHING THE LAKE COUNTY CHILDREN AND FAMILIES FIRST COMMISSION AND TRUST FUND PURSUANT TO PROPOSITION 10, THE CALIFORNIA CHILDREN AND FAMILIES FIRST ACT OF 1998

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Lake, State of California, ordains as follows:

Families First Act (the "Act") was adopted by the voters of the State of California at the November 1998 general election, and becomes effective January 1, 1999. The Act imposes a fifty cent per pack surtax on cigarettes and an equivalent tax on tobacco products, and establishes a state trust fund consisting of moneys collected from the taxes collected. Eighty percent of the funds in the state trust fund are required to be allocated and appropriated to counties which have established commissions and trust funds in accordance with the Act. The purpose of this ordinance is to establish a commission, trust fund, require development of a strategic plan describing how programs, services and projects relating to early childhood development within the County will be integrated into a consumer-oriented and easily accessible system, and otherwise fulfill the requirements of the Act.

SECTION II. <u>Commission Established:</u> The Lake County Children and Families Commission is hereby established pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 130140. The Commission shall have nine voting members designated and selected as follows:

- 1. A member of the Board of Supervisors, appointed from time to time by the Board;
- 2. The Director of the Lake County Health Services Department;
- 3. The Director of the Lake County Social Services Department;
- 4. The Lake County Superintendent of Schools; and
- 5. One member representing a community-based organization that
 - (a) has the goal of promoting and nurturing early childhood development, or
 - (b) is an organization for "Prevention or early intervention for families at risk" within the meaning of the Act, or (c) is a child care resource or referral agency, and
- 6. One member who is an educator specializing in early Childhood Development; and
- One member representing a local medical, pediatric or obstetrical association or society; and

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 Two members who are recipients of project services included in the County strategic plan.

The Commission members delineated in category numbers 5 through 8 above shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors for two year terms, but shall serve at the pleasure of the Board, and may be removed at any time, without cause, by said Board.

SECTION III. (a) Bylaws: The Commission shall adopt bylaws which shall provide among other things, (1) that only members themselves and not designees may participate in meetings, vote and be considered in determining whether a quorum is present, except for members in categories II 2, 3 and 4 above who may have a designee to act in their absence; (2) that the members of the Commission will serve without compensation, but may receive actual and necessary expenses incurred in carrying out their duties, if not otherwise reimbursed for such expenses by their employer; and (3) that the Commission's meetings are subject to the open meeting laws contained in the Ralph M. Brown Act.

(b) Strategic Plan: The Commission shall prepare a strategic plan for the support and improvement of early childhood development within the County, and shall hold at least one public hearing on the strategic plan prior to its adoption. Upon a finding that the plan is consistent with and in furtherance of the purposes of the Act and any guidelines adopted by the State Children and Families First Commission, the Commission shall adopt the plan.

The strategic plan shall include all of the elements specified in Health and Safety Code Section 130140(a) (1) (C) (ii), and shall describe how programs, services and projects relating to early childhood development within the County will be integrated into a consumer-oriented and easily accessible system.

After adoption of the strategic plan, the Commission shall:

- 1. At least annually, review the strategic plan and revise the plan as may be necessary or appropriate. The Commission shall hold at least one public hearing on its periodic review of the plan, and shall find that the plan is consistent with and in furtherance of the purposes of the Act and any guidelines adopted by the state commission before any revisions to the plan are adopted.
- Submit its adopted County strategic plan and any subsequent revision thereto, to the state commission.
- 3. Annually, prepare and adopt an annual audit and report pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 130150. The Commission shall hold at least one public hearing prior to adopting any annual audit and report.

4. Conduct at least one public hearing on the annual report of the state commission pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 130150(b).

SECTION IV. Trust Fund Established: There is hereby established the Lake County Children and Families Trust Fund, pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 130105(d) (2) (A) ("Trust Fund"). All moneys allocated and appropriated to the Lake County Commission shall be deposited in the Trust Fund, and shall be expended only for the purposes authorized by the Act and in accordance with the County's strategic plan. All grants, gifts and bequests of money made to or for the benefit of the Commission from public or private sources to be used for early childhood development programs shall be deposited in the Trust Fund and expended for the specific purpose for which the grant, gift or bequest was made.

SECTION V. <u>Commission Status</u>. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 130140.1, the Lake County Children and Families Commission is hereby established and designated as an agency of the County with independent authority over the strategic plan and trust fund established herein.

SECTION VI. Fiscal and Administrative: In furtherance of one of the purposes of the Act, elimination of duplicate administrative systems, and to facilitate the business of the Commission as an agency of the County, the Department of Health Services is designated as the administrative agent of the County Children and Families Commission. The Director of the Department of Health Services shall use established County administrative systems, including but not limited to: budgeting, fiscal, purchasing, contracting, renting real or personal property, personnel management, legal services, and automated information systems, all in accordance with County ordinances, policies and procedures, to carry out the purposes of the Act.

Prior to expenditure and in accordance with the adopted strategic plan, all moneys deposited in the County Children and Families Trust Fund shall be subsequently transferred to a special revenue fund established within the budgetary and accounting systems of the County for appropriation and administration in accordance with established County budgeting, accounting and reporting policies and systems.

SECTION VII. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional and invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and every section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Lake, State of California, ordains as follows:

Families First Act (the "Act") was adopted by the voters of the State of California at the November 1998 general election, and becomes effective January 1, 1999. The Act imposes a fifty-cent per pack surtax on cigarettes and an equivalent tax on tobacco products, and establishes a state trust fund consisting of moneys collected from the taxes collected. Eighty percent of the funds in the state trust fund are required to be allocated and appropriated to counties, which have established commissions and trust funds in accordance with the Act. The purpose of this ordinance is to establish a commission, trust fund, require development of a strategic plan describing how programs, services and projects relating to early childhood development within the County will be integrated into a consumer-oriented and easily accessible system, and otherwise fulfill the requirements of the Act.

SECTION II. <u>Commission Established:</u> The Lake County Children and Families Commission is hereby established pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 130140. The Commission shall have nine voting members designated and selected as follows:

- 1. A member of the Board of Supervisors, appointed from time to time by the Board;
- 2. The Director of the Lake County Health Services Department, or designee;
- 3. The Director of the Lake County Social Services Department, or designee;
- 4. The Lake County Superintendent of Schools, or designee.
- 5. The remaining five (5) members shall be known as "at-large" members, with priority given to geographical representation, and shall be considered by application and appointment by the Board of Supervisors from any of the following categories:
- Recipients of project services included in the County strategic plan;
- b. Educators specializing in early childhood development;
- c. Representatives of a local child care resource or referral agency or a local child care Coordinating council;

- d. Representatives of a local organization for prevention or early intervention for families at risk;
- e. Representatives of community-based organizations that have as a goal promoting early childhood development;
- f. Representatives of local school districts; and
- g. Representatives of local medical, pediatric or obstetric agencies, associations or societies.

The Commission members delineated as "at-large" in categories a through g above shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors, upon recommendation of the Commission, for two year terms, with the option to serve more than one term by means of a new appointment; but shall serve at the pleasure of the Board, and may be removed at any time, without cause, by said Board.

SECTION III. (a) Bylaws: The Commission shall adopt bylaws which shall provide among other things, (1) that only members themselves or designees authorized in Section II, may participate in meetings, vote and be considered in determining whether a quorum is present; (2) necessary protocols and procedural rules for conduct of the Commission's activities, (3) that the members of the Commission will serve without compensation, but may receive actual and necessary expenses incurred in carrying out their duties, if not otherwise reimbursed for such expenses by their employer; and (4) that the Commission's meetings are subject to the open meeting laws contained in the Ralph M. Brown Act.

(b) Strategic Plan: The Commission shall prepare a strategic plan for the support and improvement of early childhood development within the County, and shall hold at least one public hearing on the strategic plan prior to its adoption. Upon a finding that the plan is consistent with and in furtherance of the purposes of the Act and any guidelines adopted by the State Children and Families First Commission, the Commission shall adopt the plan.

The strategic plan shall include all of the elements specified in Health and Safety Code Section 130140(a) (1) (C) (ii), and shall describe how programs, services and projects relating to early childhood development within the County will be integrated into a consumer-oriented and easily accessible system.

After adoption of the strategic plan, the Commission shall:

1. At least annually, review the strategic plan and revise the plan as may be necessary or appropriate. The Commission shall hold at least one public hearing on its periodic review of the plan, and shall find that the plan is consistent with and in furtherance of the purposes of the Act and any guidelines adopted by the state commission before any revisions to the plan are adopted.

- 2. Submit its adopted County strategic plan and any subsequent revision thereto, to the state commission.
- 3. Annually, prepare and adopt an annual audit and report pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 130150. The Commission shall hold at least one public hearing prior to adopting any annual audit and report.
- 4. Conduct at least one public hearing on the annual report of the state commission pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 130150(b).

Children and Families Trust Fund, pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 130105(d) (2) (A) ("Trust Fund"). All moneys allocated and appropriated to the Lake County Commission shall be deposited in the Trust Fund, and shall be expended only for the purposes authorized by the Act and in accordance with the County's strategic plan. All grants, gifts and bequests of money made to or for the benefit of the Commission from public or private sources to be used for early childhood development programs shall be deposited in the Trust Fund and expended for the specific purpose for which the grant, gift or bequest was made.

SECTION V. Commission Status. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 130140.1, the Lake County Children and Families Commission is hereby established and designated as an agency of the County with independent authority over the strategic plan and trust fund established herein.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CERTAIN PROVISONS OF ORDINANCE NO. 2776 ESTABLISHING THE FIRST FIVE LAKE COMMISSION AND TRUST FUND PURSUANT TO PROPOSITION 10, THE CALIFORNIA CHILDREN AND FAMILIES FIRST ACT OF 1998

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Lake, State of California, ordains as follows:

Section I of Lake County Ordinance No. 2776 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SECTION I. Intent: Proposition 10, known as the California Children and Families First Act (the "Act") was adopted by the voters of the State of California at the November 1998 general election, and becomes effective January 1, 1999. The Act imposes a fifty-cent per pack surtax on cigarettes and an equivalent tax on tobacco products, and establishes a state trust fund consisting of moneys collected from the taxes collected. Eighty percent of the funds in the state trust fund are required to be allocated and appropriated to counties, which have established commissions and trust funds in accordance with the Act. The purpose of this ordinance is to establish a commission, trust fund, require development of a strategic plan describing how programs, services and projects relating to early childhood development within the County will be integrated into a consumer-oriented and easily accessible system, and otherwise fulfill the requirements of the Act.

In amending this Ordinance to clarify the roles of the county commission and the County of Lake, the County intends:

- a. To integrate its county commission into County government while recognizing the commission's decision-making responsibility under the Act; and
- b. To promote cooperation and collaboration between the commission, other county agencies and departments, service providers, and the general public toward the goal of promoting early childhood development."

Section 2. Section V. of Lake County Ordinance No. 2776 is hereby amended to read as

follows:

"SECTION V. Commission Status and Staff.

- a. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 130140.1, the First Five Lake Commission is hereby established and designated as an agency of the County within the Health Services Department. The Commission shall have sole decision-making authority to adopt a strategic plan and allocate trust funds pursuant to the Act.
- b. The Health Services Director shall appoint the executive director and shall consider the recommendations of the Health Services Director regarding said appointment. The executive director shall serve at the will of the Health Services Director. The executive director may appoint commission staff as authorized by the Health Services Director.
- c. The commission shall be responsible for all costs associated with the employment of commission staff, including but not limited to, the cost of salary, benefits, and employer retirement contributions. The commission shall indemnify the County of Lake, from trust funds, for any cost, loss, or liability arising from the actions of the commission or its staff in the course and scope of their employment."

Section 3: It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that this Ordinance may have a significant effect on the environment.

Section 4: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict and no further.

Section 5: This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption, and within fifteen (15) days after its passage it shall be published at least once in a newspaper of general circulation in the County of Lake, along with the names of those supervisors voting for and against the Ordinance.
